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

Honored guest: Intishal Al-Timimi

In this edition of the Holland Mena Film Festival, the festival proudly honors Mr. Intishal Al-Timimi festival's Honorary President, with The Hague Cinema Award, in recognition of his rich and inspiring career in the world of cinema.

Who is Intishal?

Director of El Gouna Film Festival (2017 - 2023) Strategic Adviser (since 2023) Intishal Al Timimi is a key figure in the regional film circuit, as well as a widely recognized personality in the international film festival scene. His entire career has been dedicated to supporting Arab cinematic voices, enabling them to evolve through dialogue with their counterparts within the Arab world and beyond. His efforts in this field have been duly recognized by stakeholders within and outside the Arab world. Al Timimi was born in 1954 in Baghdad, Iraq, and holds a master's degree in journalism from Moscow State University. He has held several notable positions, compiling an impressive portfolio of experiences. These include his roles as the artistic director of the Arab. Film Festival in Rotterdam (2001-2009), program advisor of the International Film Festival Rotterdam:



IFFR (2004-2011), programmer of the "Iraqi Retrospective" at the Biennale des Cinémas Arabes à Paris (2004), programmer at the Osian's Cinefan Festival of Asian and Arab Cinema (2004-2009), coordinator of "30 Years of Arab Documentaries" at the Munich International Film Festival, coordinator of "10 Years of European Cinema" at the Ismailia International Film Festival, as well as curator of the "Tribute to Johan van der Keuken."

Al Timimi also served as a programmer at the prestigious Abu Dhabi Film Festival (2008-2010), after which he became director of Arab programming (2011-2014).

He was also director of Sanad Film Fund (2010-2015), under whose leadership the fund supported numerous projects that were completed, acclaimed, and awarded at some of the most distinguished festivals around the world.

Over the past three decades, he also served as a jury member at a number of international film festivals. These include the Parma Film Festival (1989), the Munich International Documentary Film Festival (1997), the Singapore International Film Festival (2005), the Ismailia International Film Festival (2006), the AMAL - International Euroarab

Film Festival (2008), the Tallinn Black Nights Film Festival (2010), the Guanajuato International Film Festival (2013), the Munich International Film Festival (2014) and many more, where he often moderated or spoke on panels primarily addressing Arab cinema.

Al Timimi is also a member of the advisory board of Network for the Promoting of Asian Cinema (NETPAC), and has served as a member and president of the NETPAC jury at some of the most prestigious festivals, including Berlin, Karlovy Vary, Locarno, Kerala and Toronto.

He is an avid photographer and designer, whose photographic work has been featured in various exhibitions around the world. His designs, particularly book covers for Arabic literature, are widely published.




■ Special guest: Marcel Khalife

We are honored to welcome Marcel Khalife, the renowned Lebanese composer, singer, and oud virtuoso, as a special guest at the MENA Film Festival Holland.

Khalife has been a leading figure in Arabic music for over five decades, blending traditional melodies with contemporary influences to create a unique and deeply moving musical experience.

He is widely celebrated for setting the poetry of Mahmoud Darwish to music, combining artistic expression with social and political engagement.

In recognition of his contributions to culture and human rights, he was named a UNESCO Artist for Peace in 2005. We are privileged to have Marcel Khalife join us in celebrating the rich cultural heritage of the MENA region and inspiring audiences with his music and vision.

■ Special Guest: Mohamed Hefzy

We are pleased to welcome Mohamed Hefzy,a pioneering Egyptian screenwriter and producer, as a special guest at the MENA Film Festival Holland. Hefzy is the founder of Film Clinic, a leading production company in Egypt and the Arab world. Established in 2005, Film Clinic has been instrumental in producing over 40 feature films, including acclaimed titles such as Clash (2016), Sheikh Jackson (2017), Luxor (2020), and Feathers (2021). His films have been showcased at major international festivals, including Cannes, Venice, Berlin, Sundance, and Toronto, earning more than 100 international awards. In addition to his work at Film Clinic, Hefzy has been an active participant in the global film community. He has served as a jury member at prestigious festivals such as the Sundance Film Festival and the Venice International Film Festival. In 2018, he was appointed as the youngest president in the history of the Cairo International Film Festival, a position he held for four consecutive years.

Recognized for his contributions to the film industry, Hefzy has received numerous accolades. He was named the only Arab among 30 future leaders in film production by Screen International in 2013 and was featured in Variety's 500 list of the most influential people in the media industry worldwide.



In 2019, he was honored with the Arab Cinema Personality of the Year award by the Hollywood Reporter and the Arab Cinema Center.

Through his work, Mohamed Hefzy continues to shape the landscape of Arab cinema, fostering new talent and bringing diverse stories to the global stage.

OPENING FILM

■ Naji Al-Ali

This documentary, directed by Kasim Abid, offers an in-depth journey into the life and work of the legendary Palestinian cartoonist Naji Al-Ali, creator of the iconic character Handala. The film traces his life from his birth in Galilee to his assassination by an unknown gunman in London in 1987.

It explores the forces that shaped Naji Al-Ali as an artist who faced a range of challenges, including harassment, siege, displacement, exile, and terror. The documentary shows how his artistic experiences became a mirror for all Palestinians living in the diaspora. His drawings documented the struggles of the Palestinian people, critiqued Arab regimes, and carried a universal message of social justice and human rights.

SYNOPSIS

In July 1987, Palestinian cartoonist Naji Al Ali was shot by an unknown assassin. This documentary traces his life and work from his birth in Galilee to his death in London.

It examines the forces that shaped Naji Al Ali as an artist who faced a range of challenges, including harassment, siege, displacement, exile, terror and shows how his artistic experiences become a mirror for all Palestinians living in the diaspora.

FEATURE FILM JURY

Ahmed Almulla

Poet and Director of the Saudi Film Festival

Ahmed Al-Mulla is a Saudi poet and filmmaker, founder of the Saudi Film Festival in 2008, and founder of the Cinema Association in 2021. He is one of the leading cultural figures in the Arabian Gulf. He currently serves as the Vice President of the Cinema Association in Saudi Arabia and has previously held the position of Director of the Culture and Arts Association in Dammam, as well as a board member of the Mowared Cultural Foundation. Al-Mulla has contributed to the establishment and management of numerous cultural and cinematic projects at both the Arab and international levels. He has also acted as an advisor to several artistic and cultural programs. He has been honored with multiple awards and recognitions, most notably the Mohammed Al-Thubaiti Poetry Prize, and has been recognized as a prominent cinematic figure by the Saudi Ministry of Culture and various Gulf festivals.

His literary and poetic contributions are extensive, having published more than ten poetry collections and weekly articles in newspapers, in addition to writing screenplays for short films. Ahmed Al-Mulla's rich experience combines creative sensibility with organizational expertise, making him one of the most prominent cultural voices in the contemporary Saudi scene.

FEATURE FILM JURY

Sonia Herman Dolz

Documentary Film Director

Sonia Herman Dolz is one of the leading Dutch documentary filmmakers, renowned for her poetic and visually rich style in exploring artistic and human subjects. She comes from a multicultural background (Spanish mother and Czech/Peruvian father).

Her notable films include Romance de Valentía, Lágrimas Negras, Yo Soy Así, and The Master and His Pupil, most of which have won major international awards such as the Golden Hugo, Golden Calf, and Tribeca prizes. In 2023, her film DEPOT – Reflecting Boijmans had its world premiere at the International Film Festival Rotterdam and won the Grand Jury Prize at the Socially Relevant Film Festival in New York in 2024.

She has also served as a jury member at major international festivals including Rotterdam, Tribeca, Guadalajara, Seville, Madrid, and Barcelona, and her work has been the subject of retrospectives at festivals in Seville, Madrid, and Barcelona.





FEATURE FILM JURY

Kais Kasim

Film Critic & Cultural Journalist

Born in Iraq in 1954, Kais Kacem has worked in journalism and the arts since the mid-1970s. He studied journalism in Czechoslovakia (now Slovakia). He was one of the founders of the Arab Television Channel (ATC) in Gothenburg, Sweden, and was involved in producing and directing television programs for Sweden's Open Channel. He also created and hosted programs for the local Arabic radio in Gothenburg.

Kacem supervised the cinema section of Al-Usbouiya magazine and continues to write film criticism for leading Arab newspapers. He served for several years as a consultant for the Arab Film Festival in Rotterdam and worked as a web editor for the Abu Dhabi Film Festival. He actively participates in cinematic panels and workshops and regularly covers Arab and international film festivals. He is a member of the editorial board of Arab Cinema Magazine, has served on the juries of various Arab and international film festivals, and is a member of the Network for the Promotion of Asian Cinema (NET-PAC), the Arab Critics' Awards committee, and the Swedish Film Critics Association.

Abdulaziz Al-Shalahei

Abdulaziz Al-Shalahi is a Saudi director and screenwriter born in Riyadh in 1986. As a self-taught filmmaker, he is part of a new generation shaping contemporary Saudi cinema. His work explores social transformations through a distinct visual language. His film Zero Distance won the Golden Palm for Best Film at the Saudi Film Festival, while The Tambour of Retribution received multiple local and international awards, including at the Cairo International Film Festival. He was also honored with the Best Director award at the Malmö Arab Film Festival.

SYNOPSIS

In the nineties, after the Gulf War, a Bedouin family lives in complete isolation in the Saudi desert, led by a grand Father who believes the end of the world is near. His strict teachings govern everyone until a contagious disease threatens the family's stability. Inner conflicts arise between obedience and anxiety, and the mother emerges as a voice full of hope and life.

"Hobal" is a story of struggle between fear and the desire to survive, between a ruling past and a present demanding freedom

SONGS OF ADAM





Oday Racheed

Oday Rasheed is an Iraqi-American filmmaker whose works navigate between the wounded memory of Iraq and questions of exile in America. His debut feature Underexposure (2003) marked a milestone as the first film shot in Baghdad after the U.S. invasion. It premiered internationally at the International Film Festival Rotterdam and won the Best Film Award at the Singapore International Film Festival

His film Qarantina (2009) received the Jury Prize at the Oran International Arabic Film Festival. After settling in the United States in 2012, Rasheed made his first English-language film If You See Something, which premiered at the Woodstock Film Festival (2024). His latest film Songs of Adam won the Yusr Award for Best Screenplay at the Red Sea International Film Festival (2024). His films are characterized by a human tone that moves between fragility, exile, and the search for meaning.

SYNOPSIS

In the summer of 1946, under their father's strict orders, Adam is forced to accompany his younger brother Ali to witness the washing of their grandfather's corpse—a ritual from which their cousin Iman is excluded simply because she is a girl. Confronted with this haunting scene, Adam makes a defiant choice against time: he refuses to grow up. and his body stops aging. This strange transformation stirs suspicion and fear among the villagers, who begin to whisper of a curse upon him. Meanwhile, his brother Ali, witnessing his own aging, believes Adam should be isolated. Yet Iman and Anki, a shepherd and Adam's loyal childhood friend, see his condition as a rare gift that preserves the purity of innocence and the clarity of the soul. Set against the scorching desert sands and the enchanting oases of Iraq, this is a breathtaking story filled with beauty and sorrow

Mahdi Fleifel is a Palestinian-Danish director who graduated from NFTS in the UK. In 2012, his first feature-length documentary A World Not Ours premiered at TIFF and gathered around thirty awards (Berlinale, CPH:DOX, Yamagata, DOC:NYC). He took part in the Cinéfondation in 2013, and subsequently directed several short films: A Man Returned (Silver Bear 2016 EFA nomination), A Drowning Man (Cannes, Bafta nominated), I Signed The Petition (IDFA award and EFA nomination).

SYNOPSIS

Chatila and Reda are saving to pay for fake passports to get out of Athens. But when Reda loses their hard-earned cash to his dangerous drug addiction, Chatila hatches an extreme plan, which involves them posing as smugglers and taking hostages in an effort to get him and his best friend out of their hopeless environment before it is too late

Karim Elshenawy

Karim Elshenawy is an award-winning Egyptian director known for his unique storytelling style and deeply impactful narratives. He began his career with his debut film Gunshot, which opened doors to success in both cinema and television. Among his notable works are the series Qabeel, Seventh Year Itch, Take Care of Zizi, and Lam Shamsiya. His latest film, The Tale of Daye's Family, produced by his co-founded company Blueprint Productions, reflects his dedication to telling meaningful stories that leave a lasting impression on audiences.

SYNOPSIS

The film follows Daye, a 14-year-old Nubian albino boy with a remarkable voice, who faces discrimination and hardship due to his unique appearance. After being abandoned by his father and bullied, he journeys from Aswan to Cairo with his family to audition for The Voice, inspired by his idol Mohamed Mounir. Along the way, they confront theft, loss, and police pursuit amid societal prejudice. Supported by kind strangers and driven by determination, Daye strives to reach the stage and fulfill his dream. A heartfelt exploration of identity, resilience, and hope, the film showcases the transformative power of music and the strength of marginalized communities

Chakib Taleb-Bendiab is an Algerian screenwriter, filmmaker, and composer. He has worked on many feature films and is one of the screenwriters behind the British spy series GO DARK.

Chakib Taleb-Bendiab's filmography includes several compelling short films. Among them are the award-winning short flick BLACK SPIRIT, which circulated at several prestigious festivals across the globe and received the Programmers Delight Award at the 2018 Sapporo International Short Film Festival and Market in Japan, and SANG FROID, which won the Jury Award for Best Screenplay at the 2013 Sapporo International Short Film Festival and Market.

SYNOPSIS

After a little girl's kidnapping ignites a whirlwind of tension and suspicion within the city, Dounia, a brilliant psychiatrist, and Sami, a dedicated police inspector, attempt to uncover the demons of Algeria's past and solve a perplexing mystery.

There, he meets Zaynab, a self-taught painter who, despite familial rejection and the harsh realities of her environment, never gave up on her art. A woman who chose to listen to her inner voice instead of surrendering to silence, resisting in order to preserve the light within her. A renowned Egyptian screenwriter and producer, with an evolving filmography of more than 40 feature films including worldwide acclaimed titles Clash (2016), Sheikh Jackson (2017), Luxor (2020), and Feathers (2021). He served as a jury member in various international festivals including the 2022 Sundance Film Festival and the 75th Venice International Film Festival.

As of its 40th edition and for four consecutive years; Hefzy was the appointed President of the Cairo International Film Festival. In 2005, He founded Film Clinic: the now pioneer production house in the MENA region with a variety of commercial blockbusters & Art house films that have participated in major film festivals worldwide including: Cannes, Venice, Berlin, Sundance, Toronto, and Tribeca with more than 100 international awards under its belt. Later Hefzy founded Film Clinic Indie Distribution, with a mission to create opportunities for Arab independent films within and beyond festival circuits & Cofounded Meem Creative Circle which produced Netflix's first Egyptian original series; Paranormal. Hefzy was cited among 30 future leaders in film production by Screen International, headed Variety's list of Ten names you need to know in the Arab Film Industry and was among Variety's 500 list of the most influential people in the media industry worldwide. In 2019, Hefzy was granted the Arab Cinema Personality of the Year award by the Hollywood Reporter & Arab Cinema Center, Hefzy is an official member of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts And Sciences in the producers' branch. In recognition of his significant contribution to the Arab film scene, He was honored as a "Knight of the Order of Arts and Literature" from France. In 2024, He was awarded the Variety International Vanguard Producer Award within the 5th edition of the Red Sea International Film Festival.

Ibrahim Al-Ariss is a distinguished Lebanese film critic, cultural historian, and translator, widely recognized as one of the leading voices in Arab cinema criticism. Born in Beirut, he began his engagement with film as a set designer and assistant director, later studying film directing in Rome and screenwriting and criticism in London.

Since the 1970s, Al-Ariss has been a prolific journalist, contributing to major Arabic-language newspapers including Al-Hayat, Al-Safir, and Al-Dustour. He served as the cultural editor and head of the cinema section at Al-Hayat, where he authored daily columns on cinema, human heritage, and cultural history. He also founded and led two monthly magazines, Al-Masira and Al-Maqasid.

Al-Ariss has authored more than fifteen books on Arab and international cinema, including A Journey in Arab Cinema, Martin Scorsese: A Cinematic Biography, Youssef Chahine: A Child's Perspective, and Cinema: History and the World. He has translated over forty works on cinema, philosophy, and cultural history from French, English, and Italian into Arabic.

A sought-after lecturer and jury member at international film festivals, Al-Ariss is known for his insightful and nuanced approach to cinema criticism, emphasizing the ideas and cultural narratives behind the films he examines. His work continues to inspire new generations of filmmakers, critics, and scholars across the Arab world and beyond.
